

Volleyball Alberta Summer Camp Coordinator Job Description

Volleyball Alberta is seeking qualified individuals for the position of Summer Camp Coordinator in Edmonton. The Camp Coordinator will be primarily responsible for building the day-to-day content of the summer camps and ensuring age-appropriate activities and modifications are planned and prepared for. This position will begin May 1st, 2025, and end August 29th, 2025. For the summer of 2025, camps are planned to be offered in:

- Sylvan Lake with overnight and daytime options, 2 weeks with 80 athletes per camp.
- Grimshaw/Peace River, daytime options with staff travelling to coach, 1 week, 80 athletes.
- Edmonton (2) and Calgary (1) daytime camps for ages 12-16, 120 athlete's total.
- Edmonton and Calgary, early stages daytime camps for ages 6-11 years, 80 athletes.

Responsibilities and Duties

- Book, confirm and secure additional locations that may be needed for multiple camps (including catering, gyms, locations to sleep, fields, equipment, beach courts, indoor courts and so on.)
- Manage financials for all camps through an excel document
- Interview, hire, manage, supervise and train multiple Head Coaches, Assistant Coaches and Jr Coaches (if needed) for each event.
- Manage current registrations and promote the camp
- Creating in-depth schedules for each Summer Camp Week
- Create a successful pathway for our coaches to succeed prior, during and after the camp
- Order VA clothing for coaches and campers
- Manage the VA Summer Camp Website
- Create a safe environment for campers and coaches with guidelines and regulations
- Travelling out of town to run 1-2 VA Summer Camps outside of Calgary/Edmonton which requires overnight stay
- Any other duties that may arise pertaining to the responsibilities of their role
